

St Mary's Church, Bacton.

One of the oldest and certainly the largest building in the village.

Most of us pass it, if not every day then at least on a regular basis. But how many of us really notice it?

It's always been there, right?
It will always be there, right?
Well, only half right!

It will only continue to be there, as a focal point for village life for the future if we, like the generations of Bacton residents before us, make the effort to look after it.

St Mary's is your church, whether or not you go there every week. Maybe you were married there, had your children christened there or saw them married there. Or perhaps you have family or friends buried there. St Mary's is the heart of the village, commemorating Bacton's war dead and recording six centuries of Bacton life.

It is a building of great architectural and historic importance, having an unusual double hammer-beam roof and a very rare mediaeval Doom painting as well as some wonderful wood carvings.

Since the closure of the middle school, it is also the only building in the village big enough to stage major events such as concerts or plays. If we, the people living in Bacton today, don't find the money to keep the church in good repair for future generations, no-one else will and it will be lost forever.

The Friends of St Mary's was formed in 2004 with about 20 active members determined to respond to this challenge who set about raising funds for the upkeep of the fabric of the church. We're very proud of what we have achieved since then and very grateful to everyone who has helped us over the years but we need new ideas and we need new people to bring fresh energy and perspective to the group. This is where you come in.

You can help. If you can spare just a couple of hours every month or so to meet with other like-minded people to help conceive, plan or run our activities, you will find a very warm welcome. (We are not, we should make clear, a religious organisation. It is the church building only that we are concerned with).

We meet in the Church Community Room, usually on the second Thursday of the month, although not necessarily every month. The date is publicised on our website at www.fosmbacton.org.uk. The Friends of St Mary's have, over the years, raised over £125,000 from a wide variety of fundraising activities concerts, fashion shows and wine tasting evenings, metal detecting rallies, garage sales and fêtes.
